Student termination from the program or abandonment (not showing up for classes) for 2 days from the program are also considered mandatory withdrawing from the program and are subject to the abovementioned refund table. An applicant rejected by the school is entitled to a refund of all monies paid. If the student obtains a loan, the student will have to repay the full amount of the loan plus interest, less the amount of any refund, and that, if the student receives federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of the money not paid from federal financial aid funds.
